In spite of the many challenges within the profession and mental health delivery system, the MFP/ANA has an impressive success rate!



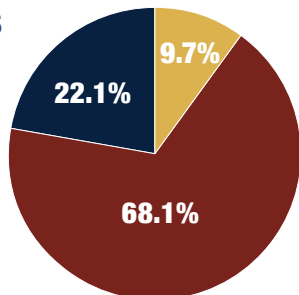
OVER 1,000 ARTICLES / RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS IN TOP NURSING JOURNALS

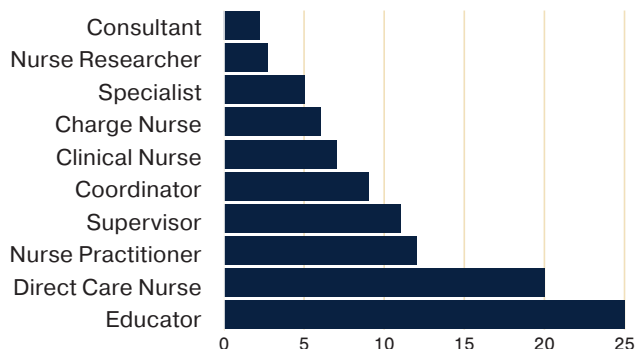
FELLOWS' PUBLICATIONS BY PERCENTAGE

- Refereed



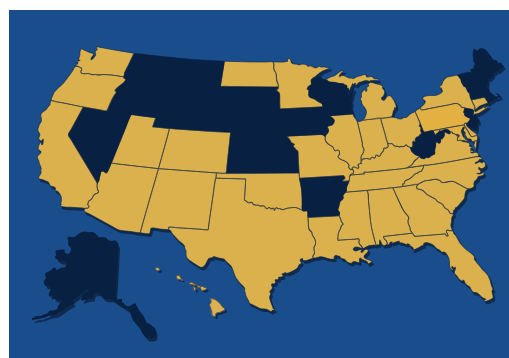
EMPLOYMENT

Fellows tend to be employed in academic institutions, or as clinicians in practice settings in the roles of staff nurse, supervisor, coordinator, clinical nurse, charge nurse, and nurse specialist. After graduation, fellows are required to commit to a minimum of two years of service in mental health and/or substance use.

Fellow graduates represent **33** states.

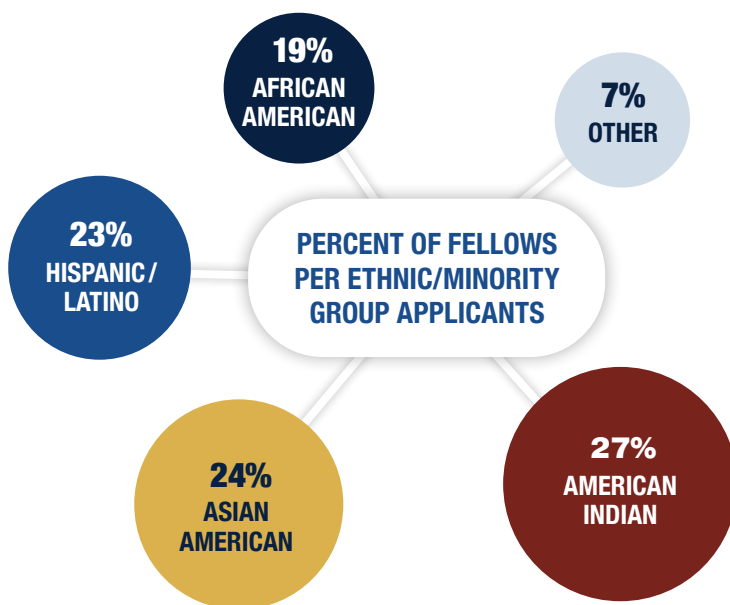
